James P. Toler has been a major contributor to and strong influence on the profession of surveying in New Mexico for decades.

For more than 20 years, Jim Toler served as the academic advisor to the Civil and Surveying Technology program at what was then T-VI, now Central New Mexico Community College (CNM).

During this time, many of today's New Mexico licensed professional surveyors and skilled surveying technicians studied under his guidance, benefiting from the rigorous, intensive curriculum in mathematics, plane surveying, cartographic techniques, computer-aided drafting, programming and boundary law.

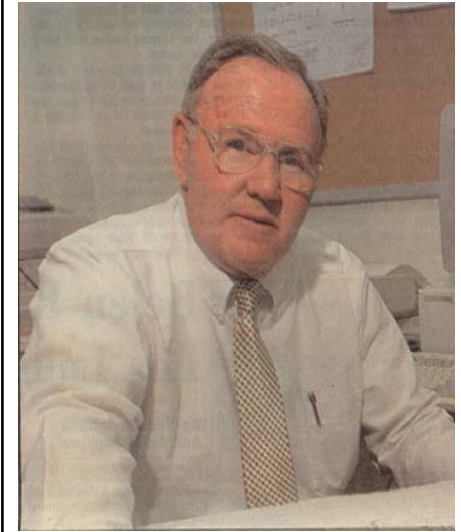
Graduates of this cutting edge program were recruited nationally by top engineering and surveying firms, as well as oil exploration companies.

Toler Endowment Scholarship at CNM.**

- Δ The fund will exist in perpetuity, only the annual earnings from the fund will be made available to the recipients.

Recipients must be enrolled in the Geomatics program at CNM, take a minimum of 6.0 credit hours, maintain a 3.0 gpa, & intend to pursue advanced studies in surveying at NMSU or other institution OR intend to complete the requirements for obtaining a certificate in Geomatics at CNM and enter the workforce upon

The CNM Geomatics Program at a Glance

Central New Mexico Community College's Geomatics program provides students an in-depth background in surveying, Computer Assisted Drafting and Geographic Information Systems.

During the three-term program CNM students learn the fundamentals of:

- Δ Surveying
- Δ Spatial data concerning man-made and natural features
- Δ Mapping
- Δ Land management
- Δ Geographic Information Systems
- Δ Photogrammetry / Remote sensing
- Δ Job and field safety

The National Society of Professional Surveyors Certified Survey Technician Program sets the technical competencies learned throughout the courses. Students who complete the Geomatics Technician Program will be prepared to take the Level 1 national exam. Survey technicians can pursue four levels of certification.
